Member's Angling Reports:

- 1. Trevor Thommers had just returned from 5 days at Venus Bay in a 3BR house for \$140 per night magnificent weather, with Salmon in the 400-900 gm range on blue bait and pilchard
- 2. John Healey and John Cummings fished Westernport Tortoise Head for an assorted bag of KG whiting, grass whiting, leatherjackets, an elephant fish, plus various banjo, pinkies and gummies
- 3. George and Judy Green fished Westernport- Middle Spit on the runout tide and kept only 1 KG whiting and 5 leatherjackets, but had a wonderful time learning from some locals alongside, berleying up whiting 42-47 cm
- 4. Lou Gerardi walked along Brighton breakwater one evening and saw many people on the inside section catching pinkies to 41 cm (one group had 33 snapper)
- 5. It was reported that 32,000 estuary perch fingerlings have been stocked in the Werribee River.

Trip Captain's Report: Goulburn River

6 members turned up on what proved to be a chilly morning. However by mid morning the sun started to warm up the region and it proved to be a lovely day for fishing. Unfortunately some one forget to tell the fish what a great day it was and they did not make much of an appearance. Most of the participating anglers caught undersized fish but sized fish were pretty rare.

The high water flow-8000-9000 mgl/day undoubtedly made for difficult fishing. The club really needs to carefully consider the value of conducting Goulburn River fishing on such high water flow days.

Annex - VR Fish/MAA Delegate Report:

New Recreational Fishing Guide now available

The 2015 Victorian Recreational Fishing Guide is now available and includes important information for anglers about size and bag limits, closed seasons and permitted equipment.

The free Guide includes colour illustrations of commonly caught fish, maps identifying important boundaries and line drawings of freshwater and saltwater fishing equipment.

The 2015 Guide also includes new maps and information about nine shipwreck protected zones along the coast and in Port Phillip Bay.

The Guide is funded by Victorian recreational fishing licence fees and complemented by other products that help anglers obey catch limits and fish sustainably. For example, plastic measures for abalone, rock lobster and spiny freshwater crayfish, fish length ruler boat stickers and abalone pocket cards.

These products, and the Guide, are available free of charge from Department of Environment and Primary Industries offices and many bait and tackle shops across the state.

The Guide is also available as a free smartphone application, called 'Vic Fishing', available to any iPhone or Android users from the iTunes store or Google Play.

The 'Vic Fishing' app has proved popular with Victorian anglers, having been downloaded more than 106,000 times.
