Angling Matters:

Members' Angling Reports (including any reports from previous Members Night):

- 1. Peter Manning travelled on and fished Bemm River for 4 days, following the Gippsland Rivers comp. Excellent weather; water level was low because lake was open to sea (too shallow to get into the river; surf was too rough to fish); good fish every day, but fish were fussy and a seal was a nuisance. Caught bream to 40 cm (980 gm) including one yellow fin bream, and 3 dusky flathead at 50cm each mainly on worm; not a lot of small fish, didn't see any mullet, salmon or tailor (although there as a report of a mullet >2kg caught on prawn)
- 2. Don Ellis gave a second hand report of salmon up to 3 kg off Anthony's Nose-Dromana

Trip Captain's Report: Social/Tuition Fishing Day at Gunnamatta Sunday 17th May Sunday was a magnificent day in terms of sun, surf, light breeze, but with a significant side drift.

14 members and one visitor fished, for about 12-15 salmon (most put back). Elwood had been invited, but gave their apologies in not attending.

Thanks go to George and Judy as tutors for newer members, and to Peter for a very enjoyable barbeque, as well as to Alex for a tasty dip.

Trip Captain's Report: Gippsland Rivers (George Green)

This was the 32nd year of the Ormond-Elwood competition. In summary, the trip was one of the poorer trips on the Tambo – the weather was excellent, but the fishing patchy at best. George and Judy fished the Tambo on Friday before the comp and found some bream downstream from the ramp.

However, on Saturday, fish were hard to find at first, until Peter Manning found some upstream from the ramp and fishing was reasonable for Ormond members over the next few hours.

On Saturday evening, Elwood put on an excellent BBQ and salads, plus appetisers, drinks, etc

On Sunday morning the fish were hard to find, with members trying upstream past the highway, to downstream past the ramp. A few flathead and bream were taken just above the ramp again.

VRFish dismayed by Small Pelagic Fishery Industry Association response

VRFish, the peak body representing recreational fishers in Victoria, today echoed the disappointment of recreational fishing bodies around Australia over the industry response to a proposal to minimise the impacts of the Commonwealth Small Pelagic Fishery (SPF) on Australia's recreational fisheries and marine life. In recent months VRFish has worked closely with the Australian Recreational Fishing Foundation (ARFF) and the Game Fishing Association of Victoria to submit a proposal that addressed many of the concerns that Australia's recreational fishers have about industrial scale commercial operations in the SPF. The collapse in the negotiations reflects a failure by the SPFIA to adequately address the ARFF proposal and the ongoing concerns of recreational fishers.

Under the plan outlined by ARFF, the proposal would have affected less than 10% of the 3 million square kilometres that the Geelong Star can fish as part of the Commonwealth SPF. The rejection of the ARFF proposal by SPFIA means that the Geelong Star is largely unrestricted in where and when it can fish. VRFish Chairman, Russell Conway said "We are disappointed by the response from the SPFIA. We are left with no option but to firmly reject their offer on the basis that it falls well short of our expectations to minimise the impacts of the SPF on our iconic recreational fisheries."

Dallas D'Silva, VRFish General Manager, added "High priority areas for Victoria at present include Apollo Bay, Warrnambool, Port Fairy and Portland. It is most disappointing that the SPFIA has not agreed to stay away from these high value recreational areas."

The recreational fishery for Southern Bluefin tuna in Portland alone has been conservatively valued at \$10 million annually and relies heavily on the aggregations of bait fish targeted by the SPF. Recreational fishing in Victoria is a \$2.3 billion industry and is vital to the economic health of regional communities. South-west game fisher and VRFish State Council member, Marty Ellul said "Regional towns would suffer if the SPF industry did not listen to the legitimate concerns of recreational fishers."

The proposed principles for future engagement from the industry are concerning, especially their unwillingness to have any spatial management agreement legislated by the Australian Fisheries Management Authority. The failure of the talks to make real progress on key issues means that Victoria's 721,000 fishers recreational fishers will now have to pursue other avenues to ensure their concerns are addressed and will ramp up opposition to the controversial trawler's plans to operate in Australian waters.

VRFish will continue to work closely with ARFF on this important issue in future.

Trout Stocking Underway

Cooler water temperatures have seen our trout stocking season commence for 2015.

Over the last fortnight Fisheries Victoria has stocked nearly 116,000 trout into 14 waters to improve freshwater fishing opportunities for anglers:

- Lake Wartook (5,000 browns & 5,000 rainbows)
- Devilbend Reservoir (5,000 browns & 5,000 rainbows)
- Wurdiboluc Reservoir (4,000 browns & 4,000 rainbows)

- Lake Glenmaggie (2,000 rainbows)
- Macalister River, below Glenmaggie (2,000 browns)
- Lake Hume (25,700 browns)
- Merri River (6,000 browns)
- Lake Fyans (1,480 browns & 6,000 rainbows)
- West Barwon Dam (3,000 rainbows)
- Lake Wendouree (8,700 browns)
- Hepburn Lagoon (5,000 rainbows)
- Tullaroop Reservoir (8,000 browns)
- Upper Coliban Reservoir (10,000 browns)
- Lauriston Reservoir (10,000 browns)

These fish are in addition to more than 61,000 trout which were released into 13 waters earlier in April. Most of the listed waters above have a history of trout stocking in recent years so already contain catchable size trout:
